Lunch Bunch

For your convenience, the Washington Pavilion will be offering lunchtime care services. This requires preregistration and can be paid for by visiting or calling the Box Office at 605-367-6000. Lunch Bunch is available from 12-1 p.m. Students must provide their own sack lunch. The Lunch Bunch will eat lunch at the Washington Pavilion and then enjoy free play time or an organized game with Washington Pavilion staff. **Lunch Bunch: \$20/week** (plus tax)

Behavior Expectations

Students attend Washington Pavilion Summer Camps to explore science, art and the performing arts in a positive, safe environment that promotes learning. To do this, each student must be responsible for his/her own actions and be aware of how his/her actions affect others, including the staff and volunteers.

- Students must respect other students, volunteers and staff. Any bullying, racism, teasing or otherwise mean behavior is not acceptable. Foul or abusive language and behavior, physical aggression or threat of physical aggression will not be tolerated.
- Students need to respect the property of others, including that of other students, the Washington Pavilion and visitors to the Washington Pavilion.

Students who choose not to follow the above guidelines after verbal warning will be removed for the day and have their parents/guardian contacted. The participants will be asked to leave the program if the behavior continues to cause a conflict in camp. Refunds will not be issued to those who are asked to leave. Please help us ensure that everyone has a safe, fun experience at camp!

If parents realize that circumstances beyond their control are going to delay pick-up, please contact the Box Office at (605) 367-6000. If you are more than 10 minutes late to pick up your child, a late fee of \$1/minute will be charged.
